

FOUNDATION YEAR

Finishing the 12th grade is a tremendous accomplishment in Zambia and something we celebrate and cherish for all of our graduates. A high school education is an important component of students' future success; however, other skills and abilities are also critical in enabling them to reach their full potential. To further invest in the growth and development of our students after high school, Family Legacy has developed the Foundation Year program to teach, train, and empower these young men and women. The Foundation Year provides personal and professional development to our graduates through:

• TRADES PROGRAM - Students enroll in a year-long program at a certified trade school that provides a comprehensive knowledge of a vocational skill.

• LIFE SKILLS SEMINARS - Excel Beyond holds monthly workshops to teach critical skills such as time management, budgeting, interviewing, and resume writing. Students also open a bank account or mobile money account.

• BUSINESS ENTREPRENUERSHIP TRAINING -While the students are taking classes in a trade of their choice, they are also enrolled in an Advanced Certificate in Business Management. The hybrid course instructs students on topics such as cost accounting, introductory business law, quantitative research, and marketing principles. Students are then prepared to either be an asset in the existing business market or start their own endeavor.

TRADES PROGRAM

Training in a marketable skill that can provide employment opportunities is an important step in helping our graduates become self-sufficient. Working with local trade schools in Lusaka, our staff enroll students in year-long vocational training programs based on their interests and abilities such as:

- Auto Mechanics
- Catering
- Computer Science
- Design Cutting & Tailoring
- Electrical Engineering
- Fashion and Design
- Hairdressing & Cosmetology

- Hospitality
- Information
 Technology
- Plumbing & Sheet Metal
- Power Electrical
- Water Operation
- & Sanitation

At the end of the program, students receive a Level One TEVETA certification from an accredited school which they can share with prospective employers. Students finish the year by completing an attachment (or, internship) to round out their practical knowledge.

LIFE SKILLS SEMINARS

Sometimes the most important skills are not academic. In recognition of this, our staff and community partners have developed monthly workshops designed to properly prepare students for independent living and future endeavors in education and work. These seminars include:

- Career and goal setting through interest surveys and guidance counseling
- Financial literacy and budgeting
- Leadership training
- \cdot Office etiquette
- Resume writing and interview skills

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Physical and mental health
- Spiritual development—how to represent Christ well
- StrengthsFinder from Gallup assessments and self-awareness

PREPARATION FOR GROWTH

Through the Foundation Year program, we continuously strive to provide the tools for our students who will enter Foundation Year as high school graduates with the objective to become thriving, successful, independent young adults who give back to their communities.

All Foundation Year students that wish to continue in higher education are asked to complete an Excel Beyond program application. Along with the application, students are required to submit an essay and gather teacher recommendations to support their grade 12 results. Not only does this give students an experience that will help them in the future, but provides the Excel Beyond team with additional feedback on the students' strengths and weaknesses. The team works with the students in reviewing university and trade school programs and counsels them through the next best step for their specific God-given talents and goals.

Another important aspect of the Excel Beyond program is the ability for students to give back within the ministry. Students are invited to participate in a peer-led mentoring program, focused on discipleship. This allows students to gain valuable leadership skills as they give back to other Family Legacy students. In addition, students are invited to apply to serve as an intern at Camp Life. Camp Life interns lead and minister to a group of 10 children through various activities, small group sessions, one-on-one time, and much more.



SPONSORSHIP

The cost to sponsor a student in the Foundation Year is \$250 a month. Sponsorships can be split between two sponsors (\$125 per month each), and can also be paid on a quarterly, semimonthly, or annual basis.
